The devotion to Mary, Undoer of Knots has become more popular ever since Pope Francis encouraged the devotion in Argentina, and then spoke about it during his first year as pontiff.

The theology of the devotion actually goes back to the second century. Saint Irenaeus wrote that, "The knot of Eve's disobedience was untied by the obedience of Mary; what the virgin Eve bound by her unbelief, the Virgin Mary loosened by her faith."

Mary's faith unties the knot of sin! So we will pray that the Blessed Virgin Mary will intercede for us all, to untie the knots of sin in our lives – so that we may be purified and ever closer to God.

Meditation for the Fourth Day of the Novena to Mary, Undoer of Knots

We give you these knots that torment us and makes us unhappy and so impedes us from uniting ourselves to You and Your Son Jesus, our Savior. We run to You, Mary, Undoer of Knots, because we trust you and we know that you never despise a sinning child who comes to ask you for help. We believe that you can undo these knots because Jesus grants you everything. We believe that you want to undo these knots because you are our Mother. We believe that You will do this because you love us with eternal love. Thank you, Dear Mother.

Meditation for the Second Day of the Novena to Mary, Undoer of Knots

Mary, Beloved Mother, channel of all grace, we return to You today, recognizing that we are sinners in need of your help. Many times we lose the graces you grant us because of our sins of egoism, pride, rancor and our lack of generosity and humility. We turn to You today, Mary, Undoer of knots, for You to ask your Son Jesus to grant us a pure, divested, humble and trusting heart. We will live today practicing these virtues and offering you this as a sign of our love for You. We entrust into Your hands these knots *[mention your requests silently here]* which keeps us from reflecting the glory of God.

FORMAT FOR PRAYING THE NOVENA:

- 1. Begin each day of the Novena to Mary, Undoer of Knots, with the Sign of the Cross.
- 2. Make an Act of Contrition. You can use any form; simply ask God to pardon your sins and make a firm purpose of amendment not to commit them again. (see at the bottom)
- 3. Pray the first three decades of the Rosary, with the appropriate mysteries for the day: Joyful (Mondays, and Saturdays), Luminous (Thursdays), Sorrowful (Tuesdays and Fridays), Glorious (Wednesdays & Sundays).
- 4. Make the meditation for the particular day (see pages 10 and following).
- 5. Complete the last two decades of the Rosary
- 6. Pray Closing Prayers (see page 9)

ACT OF CONTRITION
